Y	Y	Y	Y	Y	Public Hearings: Council adopted for first reading the ordinance to prohibit the establishment and operation of medical marijuana facilities in the City of Atascadero, with one addition to allow care givers to deliver marijuana to registered medical marijuana users. Item passed 5/0
