Y	Y	N	Y	Y	<b>Management Reports:</b> The CUP request for the 10-screen theatre, retail, restaurant located across from the Sunken Gardens, known as La Plaza Theatre, included a road abandonment of a 10 foot section along El Camino Real which is a landscape easement, as well as Atascadero Mall and to waive the 18 foot height restriction, and tree removal for the block being requested to develop. The CUP was not granted and the applicant was asked to come back before the Council with more defined plans for the entire project including various studies not limited to those such as site, drainage and parking plans. After much discussion and testimony the council agreed to gather more data for the project and requested city management to contract for no more than \$10,000 to do an economic and parking study for the project. <b>Items passed 4/1</b>
